Our initiatives include:

Bardon State School uses the Gradual Release of Responsibility Instructional Framework (Fisher, 2013), Visible Learning for Literacy (Fisher, Frey and Hattie, 2016) and the work of: Lyn Sharratt - as outlined in "Clarity", 2018; Kathy Walker - as described in "Play Matters", 2007 and "Engagement Matters", 2011; and Kath Murdoch - as outlined in "The Power of Inquiry", 2015, as foundations for its improvement framework. Our initiatives contextualise this evidence base through:

- Continued development and consolidation of an expert teaching team: weekly collaborative focus on curriculum, assessment, moderation and pedagogy;
 - o to deepen knowledge and understanding of the Australian Curriculum
 - o to further develop teacher capability in effective use of analysis tools to track student learning and inform learning goals
 - to ensure selection and utilisation of high yield pedagogical practices informed by student data - to support the effective implementation of the intended curriculum
- An effective co-teaching model to maximise outcomes for all students.
- A consistent approach to the teaching of phonics, spelling and decoding in P-3.
- A great start for all children through strong transitions into Prep.
